




Country roads can take you to Campbell County, the place full of rolling hills, flat-topped buttes, prairie lands and beautiful natural landscape. Traveling along Highway 1804, the Lewis and Clark Trail gives you fantastic vista views of Lake Oahe along the Missouri River. Sightseeing along these roads you will see wild birds, deer, coyotes, and an occasional moose. The US Highway 83 corridor runs through the middle of our county connecting us to our friendly neighbors to the North and South.

Campbell County has four small towns, Artas, Herreid, Mound City and Pollock. Mound City, the county seat, was established in 1888. Herreid is booming with business and school activities. Pollock is a recreational haven full of fun family activities. Campbell County has some of the finest fishing and hunting in the state. The damming of the river created a large lake and countless bays that now boast record-producing walleye and northern catches. Several fishing tournaments are held throughout the year bringing sport teams from around the country.

Our rural county offers the latest telecommunications and fiber optics technology, independently owned businesses, grade and high school, WEB water, available building space, and no corporate or individual income taxes. We also utilize our wind resource with the Campbell County Wind, bringing clean energy to all.





BORDER MARKERS



SD/ND Border Quartzite Markers

The border between North and South Dakota is the only border between two states marked every half mile with quartzite markers, or as the locals call them, the cow scratching posts.

In 1891 the first monument was placed where the borders of North and South Dakota and Minnesota touch. The last monument was placed 360 miles from the first, where the North and South Dakota and Montana borders touch.

TOWN OF ARTAS



Arrive in Artas!

Artas was platted in 1901 when the Soo Line Railroad extended its line from Wishek, N.D., to Pollock, S.D. It got its name from the Greek word "artos" which means bread.


A hub of agriculture in the area, the town grew and expanded having the Artas State Bank, Artas Equity Exchange Elevator, North Star Lumber Company, Kirshenmann Electric Shop, The Cream Station, two livery businesses, an implement dealership, blacksmith shops, general stores, post office and gas truck.

The Artas School provided education from 1920 to 1965 while three churches, Evangelical/United Methodist, Reformed Church and Artas Baptist Church became vacant as members worshipped in other towns.

Though fires have consumed buildings over the years, the resilient people of Artas love their town choosing to stay.

In 2001, Artas celebrated 100 years on the prairie and will probably see 100 more.

History


While Campbell County was officially formed in 1873, and formally organized in 1884, it took until 1901 when the Soo Railroad was finished to put Herreid on the map. Herreid was named after Charles N. Herreid, fourth governor of South Dakota.

The first platting of the town site covered 16 blocks. With land cheap and plentiful, the early pioneers wanted a bit more space. They desired to be less crowded than those who lived in larger towns.

New businesses came from other areas to make a bright future in a railroad town. There were two banks, general stores, a meat market, drug store, hotel, a lumberyard and a grand opera house just to name a few avenues of trade. The city, located on the banks of Spring Creek, flooded many times, but the worst disaster struck in the wake of a fire of 1910. The wood buildings fell like dominoes as the embers blazed throughout the night. One lone building, the W. Riggler Store, was standing at daybreak. The bank vault remained intact but it took several days for it to cool down before it could be opened.

Today, the City of Herreid has a variety of businesses willing to serve the customers who stop in. A new 4-Plex, and several new homes, are a welcome addition to the community. A Housing Incentive Program is available for first-time home buyers.

Mound City Bound!

Mound City may be small, but it's Mighty! Mound City is the county seat and houses all the county offices in the Campbell County Courthouse. It's home to the Safehouse Bar & Grill, which offers great food and lively service. Wild Dutchman Seeds are grown in the surrounding fields and manufactured on the family farm. Grandfather, father and granddaughter have built the business where their seeds are now shipped to all 50 states.

Lake Campbell, located 3.5 miles northwest of Mound City, is well known by locals. It has a picnic shelter, rest room, electricity and security light at nightfall. Lake Campbell is stocked by Game, Fish & Parks. Campbell County owns and maintains the 40 acre site. In addition, Lake Campbell Wildlife Club assists with site maintenance and funding as well as the Campbell County Conservation District.



History

June 10, 1884, marks the first settlers to the area. Edward C. McIntosh and his father E.H. McIntosh arrived noting the small hills dug into the prairie. The folklore tells of a bachelor living in an earthen dugout just northwest of where the town now sits. For many, they are known as bachelor mounds. For others, they are known as Indian mounds. Which story is more true has not been proven, but that is how Mound City got its name.

In March of 1885, the town was platted. As new businesses sprang up, the town grew. First an elegant hotel and a store. Next a large feed barn whose hayloft was used as a public gathering place for social events. The Mound City Progress newspaper began in 1886. The mail began arriving regularly as the town and homesteaders flourished. A stage line provided round trip service to Eureka and back in a one day trip for \$2.50 round trip or \$1.50 one way. The town was nearly 1,000 people.

Mound City became nationally famous as news media came to report on an event that lasted from 1961 to 1966. The feud started when an older building outgrew its space in the Campbell County ASCS office in Mound City. The State ASCS office voted to move to a more modern establishment in Herreid. The frustrated Campbell County Committee later cancelled the contract saying the state pressured them into signing. The office eventually moved to Herreid until the new building was built in Mound City. It was then moved from Herreid back to Mound City. A district court and federal courts ruled the move was unconstitutional saying the state did not have the power to do what they did. This set the feud into further action that moved Mound Citizens to protect the site of the Mound City office. Farmers sandbagged the front of the building on Sept. 1, 1962 refusing to let the records be moved to Herreid. To ensure this didn't happen, locals kept guard.

After much controversy, the office remained in Mound City until being combined with the Walworth County FSA office in Selby. The Campbell County Natural Resource Conservation District has use of the building now.

The town has changed over the years and businesses that once were, are now gone. Mound City celebrated its QuasquiCentennial in 2009 with a large celebration that drew nearly a thousand people to help commemorate 125 years of existence.

Mound City remains an active involved community being the smallest incorporated county seat of South Dakota.

Pollock is on the banks of Lake Pocasse and Lake Oahe. Pollock offers everyone a variety of opportunities to come and play. Recreational boating, jet skiing, camping, fishing and hunting - they have it all. The parks boast playground equipment for kids of all sizes, disc golf course, lighted tennis courts and two softball fields. Camping is available in town, at the city parks and a private business while two miles west on the Missouri River is West Pollock Recreational Area and a State of S.D. campground. Pollock has plenty of good food and beverages along with lodging all year round.



History

The town of Pollock and the recreation area are both named after a pioneer lay minister and respected citizen of the area, R.Y. Pollock. Pollock is along the Lewis and Clark Trail on Highway 1804 and offers breathtaking views of the Missouri River, gorgeous sunrises, sunsets and abundant wildlife. Visit the Visitor/Interpretive Center on Main Street to see displays of Indian artifacts, Lewis and Clark memorabilia, newspaper clippings and pictures of the moving of the town and specialty displays.

Moving the Town

Though there were several natural disasters over the years to the town in the way of the frequent flooding of Spring Creek and severe damage to the business district caused by the fire in August 1911, the town of Pollock persevered.

A major change came in the 1950s when the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers built a dam at Pierre that was to flood the town of Pollock in the area it originated at.


The Pollock Flood Association was organized Jan. 2, 1953 to help plan for the coming flood. A town meeting Jan. 27, 1953 was held where a show of hands decided to keep their town together and relocate rather than to disband. After several votes, it was decided unanimously to move to higher ground south of its current location.

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the new town were held June 4, 1955. The design of the new city was done by Scott Engineering of Watertown. Their second draft had the design of wider streets which is now the town's trademark.

Many houses were moved from Old Pollock to New Pollock while many others were built new. Although it was hard to see their old town disappear, it was exciting to see the new town being built.

Over 15,000 trees were planted by volunteers in the boulevards and shelterbelts that made Pollock what it is today.
